What an incredible time of transition for us and our helpers as we complete our moving into Mike & Pam's home in Birdsvew; moving out from the Garden of Eden and continuing the smorgasbord of ministry that we have always been doing, but are now doing in different communities and in the home of our co-laborers spread throughout Skagit Valley and Snohomish County and as far east as Moses Lake. Most of our mornings, we enjoy our devotion time together as a family before allowing the Holy Spirit to lead us individually or corporately to our next assignment. We were blessed by our time with our son-in-law, Jack, during time with the family prior to his going to be with the Lord. We have continued with the weekly women's meeting in Sedro Woolley where the ladies just finished the "Fear or the Lord" study by John Bevere. There next study will also be by John, "Good or God – Why good without God is just not enough!"

It was also a month of spending evening and night with Diane Sipe who works tirelessly for those that are in need upriver and especially those that were recent victims of the flooding. Far more than just a bowl of chili or soup and a hot cup of coffee, but help cleaning up, rebuilding and even getting people an RV or trailer. It is a blessing to witness the joy and love that quickly bonds these saints, children, youth, adults and the elderly together. "How beautiful are the feet of those that bring good news". The good news: "Jesus loves you and He sent us to love and help you, your family, your home and if possible, your pets and livestock." It was an opportunity to use our firewood fundraiser to help those in need. The ministry started through a friend that gave us trees he cut down on his property and is now being supplied with logs from a friend and brother in Christ that has a logging company. Praise God! We are also having our Wednesday morning men's meeting at Bonnie Jo's in downtown Sedro Woolley.

We have been blessed by our brothers and sisters at the New Life at the Well that have extended the right hand of fellowship to our Salt & Light Sunday afternoon service and also allowing us to continue to host the Child's Evangelism Fellowship monthly prayer luncheon.

We are also thankful to be a part of the Lyman church family, involved in the Sunday morning devotions and service afterwards and the Thursday afternoon family night which brings adults, youth and children together. We have been blessed to be part of the Lyman church

family starting with Promise Keepers in 1995, 5 years before Harvest Vision Ministries started in 2000.

We have also been blessed to have use of a shop with a car lift to work on cars and trucks for people in need that cannot afford to maintain their vehicle, this is the same shop that we have been allowed to set up for one of our Harvest Kids locations. We have been allowed to set apart a portion of the shop with room dividers that are black (sin), red (the blood of Jesus), white (sins forgiven), green (the Holy Spirit) and yellow (heaven) and with all the other things that are needed to host and enjoy being witness to these young disciples loving Jesus, each other and providing basic needs for orphaned and vulnerable children in central Africa. We have also been given the opportunity to make those same provisions for hosting Harvest Kids in the greenhouse of the woman that host the women's meeting in Sedro Woolley. Because we are no longer committed to a central meeting place, we will be able to continue doing more ministry, including Harvest Kids, at different homes in different communities in our area. Jesus does make house calls or you may consider it "Door Dash for the Gospel"!

The Harvest Kids had their final Harvest Kids at the Garden of Eden on Jan 10th on Avon Allen Rd in Mount Vernon. We had our good times at the Garden of Eden with Harvest Kids. The Harvest Kids will now be meeting more locally in their hometowns, and in the homes and properties of others giving the Harvest Kids more opportunities to do what God has called them to do and empowering them to take on responsibility. That will bring more souls and people to not only know about Harvest Kids but most importantly know who our Lord and Savior is Jesus Christ of Nazareth. After three and a half months the Harvest Kids were able to reach the goal for the Busolwe children's church in eastern Uganda. The cost to build it was \$2,735 dollars. We thank our brother in Christ Fred DeVries for opening up his home and property to the Harvest Kids allowing us to have the First Harvest Kids after 13 years in the home of George and Linda's home. We celebrated the birthday of Harvest Kids who are 13 years of age, singing happy birthday to all the kids in Africa who don't know when their birthday is. Harvest Kids now meet the 2nd Saturday at Fred DeVries shop, 12797 Thillberg Rd. Mount Vernon & the 4th Saturday at Mike & Lisa's Noels Greenhouse, 9419 Soren Rd. Sedro Woolley from 11am-1:30pm. We also meet with the Harvest Kids as the Lord directs in each community. The Harvest Kids are currently at \$317 for helping remodel for a kindergarten in the slums of Kampala, Uganda.

Mexico

Olivia continues to teach the children that are a part of the same church family that started the feeding ministry on Saturdays. She also drives her grandchildren back and forth to school during the week. God willing, we will soon make a little trip over to the Harvest Vision Home church in San Luis Rio Colorado, Mexico to bring some resources to help Olivia in her children's ministry to do live action Bible plays. Olivia over-sees a local women's group that began when we started the ministry working with many local pastors. Linda had such a burden for the wives that she has organized an annual women's retreat for pastor's wives every year. Olivia's husband, Miguel, works full time for a cable company, but as soon as he gets home he is sharing the word of God and helping with worship at other church families.

We are also hoping to make a future mission trip down to Guerrero in south Mexico to assist Pr. Obed and his family continue spreading the love of Jesus in Guayameo, the community where they live, and the smaller communities that live in the nearby mountains where the majority of the people aren't able to read. God willing Child's Evangelism Fellowship will help us in providing Wordless Books for us to take on the mission trip. The Wordless Book does not have any words and uses different colors to teach the gospel.

Africa

This is the year of God's favor. As we have partnered with Martin and our co-laborers in the harvest fields of Africa for the last 25 years, the Lord has continually responded to our prayers to bring more workers into the harvest fields. They have labored in those fields and now when true communication is needed more than ever before, God has supplied some workers that have incredible communication and visionary skills and a new website has been started to give us the opportunity to witness the continued expansion of God's kingdom in central Africa. What a blessing to witness the church of Jesus forcefully advancing empowered by the love of Jesus to spread the gospel. Jesus said, "And this gospel of the kingdom **will** be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end **will** come." (Mt 24:14). We are thankful for the winning and discipling of souls that allows each new believer to find their calling and gifts and be prepared to do the work that God created them to do. This labor of love is ongoing through the appointed coordinators that help organize the many church families throughout central Africa. The bible schools continue to help teach and support the shepherds and leaders that God appointed for these church families. They are taught to "obey what Jesus has commanded" so they can lead by example and avail themselves to the ongoing teaching of the Holy Spirit as church families are strengthened and new church families - whether in the deserts of South Sudan, south Ethiopia or north Kenya or the jungles of Uganda, Burundi or the DR Congo - are planted. The believers in the church families are held accountable for the initial discipleship of new believers until they are established in strong church family.

We were blessed that although there was scattered violence during the annual presidential election and communications were interrupted, including internet, the president was re-elected and calm has been restored. Unfortunately, the poor communication problems are off and on and create difficulty for our fellowship who are widely scattered and depend on good communication. We are thankful that our faithful coordinators, teachers shepherds and believers are fully dedicated to reaching everyone with the love of Jesus regardless of the sacrifices that are required and these decisions are made with the support of their entire family, including their children. The registration of Harvest Vision in Kenya is now back on hold. The government imposed a new requirement that someone on the board must have a theology Bachelor's Degree from a university. We thank God that Daniel, who is the pastor of the HVA church in Kenya and is Kenyan is lacking only one year to receive his degree.

We are thankful that with the support of Harvest Kids in the USA, construction has began on a new children's church in Busolwe in eastern Uganda. The Harvest Kids will now be helping the local believers in the mother church located in the slums of Kampala, to start a kindergarten day care for 3-5 year olds using the Kabalagala church property with plans for completion in December and school starting in January 2027.
