Africa Praise Report

**Crusades: 4,833; Salvations: 543,141**

There is a heaviness that sinks into your chest when you think about whether the people you love will come to Jesus before time runs out. It trails you through ordinary days and stays with you when the house grows quiet at night. When you truly love someone, you care about more than their comfort or their success. You care about their forever. You care about their eternity. You care about their soul. You care about the part of them that only Christ can save. And as you watch their lives unfold—when you notice the patterns they hold onto, the pain they carry, or the directions they choose—a gentle but constant fear starts to rise. You wonder if they can feel God reaching toward them. You wonder if they will answer. You wonder if the window is closing faster than you want to admit.

This is where faith stretches beyond what you can say. This is where placing your family in God's hands becomes one of the bravest forms of love you will ever practice. Because you can encourage, you can intercede, you can speak truth with tenderness, and you can live as an example. But you cannot change a heart. Only Jesus opens eyes to what has been hidden. Only Jesus loosens what is bound. Only Jesus saves. Family lives close to your heart. Family carries your history. Family holds your affection. Family holds your worries. So, when you see them pull back, shut down, or push against God, it feels deeply personal. It feels crushing. It feels like standing helpless at the edge of something far bigger than you.

But God has not backed away. He has not forgotten. He has not brushed aside your prayers. He is working beyond what you can see. He is protecting them in ways you cannot measure. He is setting up moments you don't even know about. He is clearing obstacles that have kept their hearts closed. Often the most painful seasons are the very ones that prepare the soil. Often the struggles that scare you are the tools God uses to soften them. Often the silence is where His voice is doing its quietest and deepest work.

So don't lose heart. Don't stop praying. Don't let fear convince you that nothing is happening. God's timing is perfect, even when it feels unbearably slow. He speaks to them in restless nights. He stirs their thoughts when life feels unstable. He places people in their path who reflect His truth. He plants seeds that will grow when the moment is right. God is calling. God is guiding. God is reaching. So, keep your faith steady.

Keep praying with expectation. Keep loving them with gentleness. Keep walking in peace so they can recognize Christ in you. Keep trusting that Jesus is still writing their story. The moment will come. The shift will begin. Their heart will soften. The door will open. And it won't happen because of your striving, but because of God's grace. When that day arrives, you will see it clearly. You will understand that God never overlooked your tears. He never ignored a single prayer. He never wasted one moment. He was moving all along—through the stillness, through the struggle, through the waiting. You will look back and find purpose in every delay. You will see protection in every hardship. You will notice God's hand woven through their entire journey. Every tear you cried was known to Him. Every burden you carried was seen by Him. Every prayer you whispered was heard and used by Him.

So lift your head, dear friend. You are not walking this road by yourself. God is with you. God is with your family. And while there is still time, He is working far deeper than you can imagine. Your prayers matter. Your faith matters. Your love matters. And God is at work. Nothing offered to Him in faith is ever wasted.

What an amazing time this month of February. Lots of stuff going on with Harvest Kids, collecting cans, moving to different locations and preparing. Preparing for what the Lord has planned, expanding the territory of His people. We were blessed to have our first Harvest Kids at Mike and Lisa's greenhouse. The Harvest Kids counted money for helping build the kindergarten in Uganda Kabalagala. The Harvest Kids counted \$152 and the number currently is \$469. We continue to press forward to the goal on helping build the kingdom of God. We had a very touching message Feb 15th at Harvest Kids. It gave the Harvest Kids a good example of what we are trying to do. St. Valentine, a man devoted to God, who was killed on Valentines Day in Ancient Rome for his faith. That Valentine's Day is not about chocolates, teddy bears and flowers. It's something more than that. It's about loving God and loving others more than yourself. Every day, not just on special occasions. That's just teaching the children to love under all conditions. God's love is unconditional. "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others. Philippians 2:3-4." ### Mexico

Miguel and Olivia are sharing the Word of God and are in fellowship with the believers at Iglesia Betsaida with Pastora Carmen on Fridays. Carmen helps coordinate the local women's group that Linda helped start years ago and they will be having a retreat in San Luis when Linda and Pam go on their mission trip the first week of April. They will also be driving through the Navajo reservation to visit our sister, Cecilia, on their trip down. The women's group is going on the first Monday of the month to serve coffee, fellowship and pray at one of the local parks. The government shut down feeding people in the parks recently because some people got sick. Miguel and Olivia are also sharing and joining Maria at the Iglesia Puerta de Estretcha (the Narrow Gate) for prayer meetings every week. Miguel, who worked at the cable company for years now works as a maintenance person at a chain of stores (BIC) scattered throughout the city. They also have a Christian brother from Cuba that is renting their small home in another part of the city. They are still in contact with the many brothers and sisters that we have partnered with for years in the community as well as now taking care of the grandkids that belonged to their son who went to be with the Lord following an automobile crash a few years ago.

Pastor Obed and Zury and their family continue to share the love of Jesus in the southern state of Guerrero in a small village named Guayameo. Please keep them in pray because there are gangs associated with the drug cartels who are indiscriminately causing a lot of violence which makes every moment in their community very volatile. Sadly, it is not unusual for them, and they continue to come up with creative ways to reach, visit and share the gospel as a family. They are blessed with three beautiful and gifted daughters that have gifts of music. Obed and Zury are both worship leaders and also teach music to adults and children in their small community. Whenever the rain allows, they visit and pastor the two small church families in the mountains near-by. "How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of those that bring good news."

### Africa

Over the years, the Holy Spirit has revealed the super-natural wisdom found in Proverbs 15:22, "Plans fail for lack of counsel, but with many advisors they succeed." That is why, without forsaking the gospel, the first part of every year, much time is set aside for praying, fasting and seeking God's plan and vision for the work we will be coordinating in different areas in the sphere of influence the Lord has entrusted to us.

Many thanks to our co-laborers in the USA, Canada and Mexico that pray and have provided support for our many co-laborers in central Africa – Uganda, Kenya, South Sudan, Burundi and the DR Congo. With the encouragement from your prayers and support, we now have missionaries scattered to different parts of Africa, the middle east, Europe, North America and even Australia.

A number of years ago, Simon, our coordinator in the desert region of north Kenya needed a truck to travel to the many different tribal groups scattered throughout the region and has even evangelized and planted church families in south Ethiopia. After these years, the truck engine failed and is broken down in Nairobi. The cost of the full overhaul, new tires, etc is 422,000 Kenya Scillings (\$3,350). We are thankful that one of our donors has made a donation for a portion which confirms that need, so we, with faith will be sending the amount required to get his team back into those harvest fields.

Two years ago, while ministering in Georgia in the USA, Martin met with the Renew Outreach ministry group and found out about solar-powered evangelism back packs with all the equipment to meet the practical needs of the evangelist and equipment needed to evangelize in these types of conditions. We purchased one and we are now in need of two that will help reach the scattered tribes and Muslims that live in these remote areas. For one set with wifi, screen, projector, solar panels, sound equipment that can be carried by one person for evangelism to groups up to 300 people is \$2,060 plus shipping from the USA to Nairobi, Kenya. This is another of the creative ways which the Lord has provided to reach as many people as possible. Each location is scheduled for whatever followup, including discipleship of new believers and pastoral support that is needed to strengthen the existing church fellowship or support the new church family.

We currently have the widows of two of our former coordinators, John Light (South Sudan) and Kennedy Mtyaba, (Kaliro, central Uganda). Sarah, John's wife, lives in the Adjumani refugee camp in north Uganda, where we were able to help her with schooling and set up a small business. Her youngest child attends school in Gulu a short distance away and the other two are in school in Kampala under the oversight of Martin and his wife and Suzan, the HVA admin coordinator and her husband. Joan, Kennedy's wife, lives in Kampala and attends the Kabalagala church family and is being supported through their help. Recently, George, a friend of Martin from England has connected with him and wants to begin a ministry targeted to help the families of these men who have already been promoted to be with Jesus.

Martin is thankful for the Busolwe children's church that has been constructed in eastern Uganda which the Harvest Kids from the USA provided the funding for. He is waiting for the estimate one of the brothers from the church will be providing to send to Harvest Kids to refurbish some buildings on the church property to begin a kindergarten day care for 3-5 year old children from the slum neighborhood. This will also give the kid's family members the opportunity to come and help with the teaching when they are able to break away from their task of trying to make enough money to feed and care for their families and orphans that live around them. A win – win for everyone and a super blessing to everyone that helps and a super – super blessing for God who inspires the vision and ultimately provides all the needs. The vision is to complete the day care and open in January 2027.
