God has called the pastor in Africa to help. God called people to help the pastor build the school in Africa and people in the USA to help sell and others to purchase the corn. Corn was planted in the spring of 2019, harvested and sold in the fall and the school was completed in December 2019. Now the corn has been planted and is being harvested and sold in 2020. Pr. Charles, the Harvest Vision Ministries coordinator in Kayunga in central Africa is now “that” pastor called. They are now completing a new church fellowship building to accommodate the 350 believers in this strong Muslim community and they have purchased an adjacent property to build a school, starting with kindergarten and then going to primary 7. There is no school close and even some of the Muslims who have yet to be saved have agreed to let their children attend to get an education. It is true, that without the support of praying and faithful Christian youth and adults, these kids would find it difficult to fulfill their mission. Kids from different cultures, ethnicity, language and 10,000 miles apart using the need for education to spread the good news of Jesus Christ.

Mexico and Central America

We are so thankful for our coordinator’s around the world and the wonderful way in which their families work together to continue shining the light of Jesus into the people in their communities and in their sphere of influences. Whether it is Miguel and Olivia in San Luis, Sonora, in north Mexico or Obed and Sury in Apatzingan, Michoacan in south Mexico or Gloria and Sergio in El Salvador, their families continue to bring hope through the message of God’s love to all people through the forgiveness of sin and eternal assurance from a Father who constantly proclaims: “This is My son” or “This is My daughter whom I love and with him” or “her, I am well pleased.” “Unless the Lord builds the house, its builders labor in vain. Unless the Lord watches over the city, the watchmen stand guard in vain. Sons are a heritage from the Lord, children a reward from Him. Like arrows in the hands of a warrior are sons born in one’s youth. Blessed is the man whose quiver is full of them. They will not be put to shame when they contend with their enemies in the gate.” (Psalms 127:1, 3-5)

Olivia is still in Arizona waiting patiently on the Lord’s decision concerning her residency papers. She is doing children’s ministry with Pedro and Lilabeth’s children where she is staying while waiting. Church ministries in Mexico and El Salvador are still on lockdown, which has redirected our sharing of the gospel down to the more personal and powerful one on one, door to door, home to home and family with family way in which the Church had to live and grow after the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. In San Luis, Miguel and Yvann, continue to have the mission home open for fellowship and prayer. They have home fellowship there on Sundays and home fellowship in other believer’s homes on Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday. The fellowship center adjacent to the mission has been used for baptisms and the worship trailer is still available for outreaches. Obed and Suri, along with their children and other believers, are doing door-to-door and home ministry in Michoacan as well as, Sergio and Gloria in El Salvador. Sergio and Gloria’s young family are actively involved in using every opportunity, including their family owned business connections, to spread the gospel to everyone they are involved with.

Africa

“This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down His life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers. If anyone has material possessions and sees his brother in need but has no pity on him, how can the love of God be in him? Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth.” (1 Jn 3:16-18) We praise God for the opportunity to partner with all of our co-laborers in central Africa. In July, they coordinated 15 crusades and did extensive door to door evangelism and witnessed 1,326 be born again and are now being drawn into local home church fellowships that will teach them to be true disciples of Jesus Christ bringing even more into the kingdom. Even with this growth and the responsibility to train these new believers to be true disciples, we are encouraged by the vision to start a church plant on the property rented in Iganga, east of Kampala. A half million people live in this most Muslim populated city in Uganda. Even in the midst of the temptation to draw back and take care of our immediate church families, the vision to send 15 believers to build the church fellowship with a focus on home church groups is a testimony to the Holy Spirit's power to fulfill the command of Jesus to: "Therefore go and make disciples."

Although the Kibuli fellowship in Kampala can’t have services, they are discipling about 120 new believers using the small homes that we purchased next to the main building. Door to door ministry is active in resident’s homes where they are hosting 22 home churches with 36 ministers and are expecting to have 30 by the end of August. We were blessed to be able to help Pr. Charles and the Harvest Vision Church family in Kayunga in central Uganda with their building that they have worked so faithfully on. Pr. Charles purchased a property adjacent to the building to start a primary school because there is no school close and some of the Muslims will be sending their children. We are thankful that the Harvest Kids in the USA will be fundraising to help with building the school. The forward plan is to allow church buildings to have services soon but they will be required to have certain equipment, such as masks and thermometers. Pr. Martin will use some of the money that was sent to support the larger crusades to help the church families get the necessary equipment to have in person services. The coordinators have been able to evangelize and teach within the restrictions and guidelines that have been imposed on them by the government. South Sudan remains closed and we are hoping that Martin and Prossy will be able to visit soon and prayerfully transition the coordinator responsibility to someone there. Prossy has now married and lives outside of Kampala where she will begin to focus on school and student ministry.

We have been blessed during this month’s garage sale with produce from the Garden of Eden farm and corn from the local farmer and his family that donate their harvest to help the Harvest Kids. Great fellowship and ministry throughout the day. So many sharing their journey of faith and wanting to help donate items to the garage sale and know they are helping the kids build a school for vulnerable children in Africa with every ear of corn that they walk away with.

“The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it.” (Genesis 2:15)
We are thankful for the work on the Garden of Eden family ministry in west Mt. Vernon and are blessed by those that have come forth to make this vision a reality. Soon, there will be other Gardens that God will restore. We are blessed with the variety – garden, picnic area, firepit, worship trailer for praise, sharing the Word, puppet shows or videos, plus horseshoes, soccer, tether ball, badminton, bean bag & ring toss, parachutes, etc. We are hoping to see all the gifts being used: “Every good and perfect gift comes from Father of the heavenly lights who does not change like the shifting shadows.” (James 1:17) “Everyone. Everything. Everyday. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.” (Acts 2:42-47)

The Harvest Kids met on the 2nd and 4th Saturday and have crushed lot’s of cans and brought their coins to help with the mosquito nets needed by the Nalidi Grace primary school in Uganda. The kids collected money for the 25 girls and sent it earlier in the year. The school notified the kids that the school had no food, so the kids told them to use the money to buy food and they would start replacing the money when they were able to meet again, then they would get the 29 nets for the boys. They achieved that and sent the money for the 25 on August 10th and the pastor reported that the prices had changed and they were able to get all the nets except 9 and the kids already have that. Praise God! During our time together we focused on how the power of the Holy Spirit can help us become “giants” and accomplish the work that God has called each of us as believers to do. The reverse was, when we don’t trust God we allow our problems to become “giants” to us and then we appear as grasshoppers full of fear and doubt. Madilyn reminded us that Adam was made from the dust, so the kids took Playdough (colored wet dust) and using some cords and batteries had enough power flowing through that “dust” to light up small led lights. Great lunches, games and stories from God’s Word about David and Goliath. Thanks to Madilyn for reading our scripture for the day: “Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in Me. In My Father’s house are many rooms; if it were not so, I would have told you. I am going there to prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with Me that you also may be where I am. You know the way to the place where I am going.” Thomas said to Him, “Lord, we don’t know where You are going, so how can we know the way?” Jesus answered, “I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me.” (John 14:1-6).

Many thanks to Lynn from Child’s Evangelism Fellowship and her dedicated co-laborers from Christian Youth in Action, that poured out the love of Jesus on the over 20 different children that came to the 5-day club at the Garden of Eden property Monday-Friday from 10am-noon. The week was filled games, singing, contest, memorizing scriptures and messages that ensured each child understood the gospel and was given an opportunity to receive the free gift of forgiveness of sin and have an eternal relationship with the Father. Others, were given the opportunity to commit to a deeper relationship as a true disciple. We are thankful that these children were able to share their own thoughts and ideas throughout the week because of the inter-active curriculum that Child’s Evangelism Fellowship has been given by the Lord to reach children throughout the world. This was also our first outreach at the property where the Garden of Eden was birthed.

Let’s take a trip down memory lane. God calls a couple from Sedro Woolley, WA to go to Africa, 10,000 miles away. God calls a young mother and her two daughters in Washington to reach out and help orphaned and other vulnerable children in Africa. God calls a young man in northwest Uganda to build a school to help children in his community. The couple from Sedro Woolley go and visit the children in the pastor’s school that are meeting under a tree. The kids in Washington find out about the kids under the tree and share that with others. God calls a local farmer and his family in Skagit Valley to grow corn to help the kids in northwest Washington help the kids in Africa that (continued)
