Mexico and Central America

As the lockdown in each state of Mexico and in El Salvador change, our coordinators are leveraging every opportunity to strengthen the Body and reach the lost in their areas. Miguel and Olivia, our coordinators in San Luis, Mexico have not been able to be together for over 3 months. Olivia is in Arizona waiting for the immigration courts to open and give their decision on her request for a renewal of her residency visa. In the meantime, she is ministering to the children in the family that she is living with. The border into Mexico is limited to local residents and medical emergencies. Miguel, and their son, Yvann, are staying as active as possible and had an outreach in one of the local neighborhoods the end of the month sharing the word of God, praying and serving tortas to everyone. They will be visiting one of the families that attended the outreach this week with the hope of starting another home church or bible study. The church fellowships are now allowed to be open with 30% capacity, masks and social distancing. Miguel and Yvann are doing home churches, bible studies and discipleship training as much as possible.

They are able to stay in contact via internet with Pr. Obed and Sury, who coordinate the ministry in Michoacan in south Mexico. They are now doing a live service, with restrictions on Saturday, a virtual prayer service on Wednesday and virtual prayer with the local leadership daily. They are planning a evangelical outreach to launch as soon as they are allowed. We have been sending monthly support to Miguel and Olivia and to Sergio and Gloria in El Salvador and will start sending some monthly support for Obed and Sury this month. The restrictions in El Salvador have been revised to allow some travel, so Pr. Sergio with his son, Josue, made his first trip back to visit our co-laborers in eastern El Salvador on September 21st. We introduced Sergio to the believers in that area when we launched the ministry the end of February, immediately prior to the lockdown so this was an encouragement to everyone involved.

Africa

In August, our coordinators organized 12 crusades and did extensive door to door evangelism and witnessed 1,136 be born again. These new believers are now being drawn into local home church fellowships that will teach them to be true disciples of Jesus Christ bringing even more into the kingdom.

“I tell you the truth, whoever hears My Word and believes Him who has sent Me has eternal life and will not be condemned; he has crossed over from death to life.” (John 5:24)

These are a couple of the testimonies we have received this month.

“Today I was on my way from discipleship and follow up mission when I met a demon possessed young lady with her eight month old baby and her husband. They were coming back from the garden and the lady was suddenly attacked by demons, When I came on the scene I prayed for her and she was delivered. Both her and the husband confessed Christ right there on the way. We hurry the glory back to our dear Lord Jesus Christ. Pastor Titus (Coordinator for southeast Uganda).

“This mama needs our prayer. She accepted Jesus Christ in her life at the age of 75. She was hospitalized, thanks to the Lord, she's home today. We gave her a solar-powered audio bible from our co-laborers in the USA so she can listen to God's Word. This audio bible will allow her to listen to the word of God at home even if she's sick. I come praying for her, I have faith that God will touch her. Pastor Augustine (Coordinator for western DR Congo)

“The concept of progress that should be uppermost is the growth and multiplication of the Word of God. 6 people came to Christ due to our mid-week and Sunday morning glory preaching. 8 people were brought to Christ by the discipleship network and home cells fellowship program.” Pastor Christopher (Coordinator for northwest Uganda)

“Children ministry is going well in Cibitoke Province.” Pastor Evariste (Coordinator for Burundi)

We are thankful that the church fellowships in the majority of central Africa have reopened with guidelines for masks, social distancing and temperature guns. Because of our limitations on being able to do outreaches with our equipment, Pr. Martin is using some of those funds to purchase the temperature guns so the churches can reopen. We are thankful that the new church facility in Kayunga, central Uganda, is completed and doing services. This is also the location of the new Harvest Doves primary school that Harvest Kids, Fellowship Ministries (Wayne Watne) and our brother, Steve Patterson, in Tennessee have sent funds to start. There is enough to purchase the property for the four classroom school and some extra. We only need \$4,510 to complete the school with school supplies. The church structure in Iganga in central Uganda now has a roof and is being finished on the inside. A half million people live in this most Muslim populated city in Uganda. Even in the midst of the temptation to draw back and take care of our immediate church families, the vision to send 15 believers to build the church fellowship with a focus on home church groups is a testimony to the Holy Spirit's power to fulfill the command of Jesus to: "Therefore go and make disciples." We are still in need of about \$2,000 to finish construction, chairs and worship equipment. The Harvest Kids were able to send all the money needed to replace the mosquito nets for the children that live at the Nalidi Grace Primary School in eastern Uganda, with a little extra. We were also blessed to hear that the well that was drilled for the school and the community a few years ago that recently broke was repaired and clean water is now available again. Also, the well that was drilled in Juba in South Sudan has not worked since installation because it was waiting for the solar powered system that was being supplied by our co-laborers from Step 30 ministries in Taiwan is now operational. All these incredible miracles taking place even in the midst of all the confusion. “Though the mountains be shaken and the hills be removed, yet my unfailing love for you will not be shaken nor My covenant of peace be removed,” says the Lord, who has compassion of you.” (Isaiah 54:10)

Jan 2007-August, 2020 Africa Praise Report - Crusades: 3,249- Salvations: 370,091

What a wonderful month of fellowship and encouragement as we have hosted the produce and garage sale that have brought people together to give and help each other, including our brothers and sisters of faith in Africa. We were also blessed that Pam has had the time to add some videos to the website. Please check out the home page: "People of the USA" and "People of Africa". We also added some picnic tables, storage shed and a sandpit for the Garden of Eden ministry. We were pleased and blessed to host the monthly Child's Evangelism Fellowship at the Harvest Home and will be doing that again in October. Thanks to the people that helped plant and harvest the crops, including the sweet corn, that the Harvest Kids used to get donations that have been sent to Uganda to build a primary school for vulnerable, less fortunate children, many of whom are orphans. Thanks to Walker Motor Works in Marysville for making corn available at their car dealership, Fellowship Ministries that hosted a garage and produce sell in their community on the Samish River and our fellow co-laborers from Tennessee that donated to help with the school project in Africa. We were blessed to receive over \$2,000 for the 6,000 ears of sweet corn we harvested. We have sent \$3,250 that is enough to purchase the property and start construction and the kids are praying that others will help as they continue to collect their change to have the \$4,510 to finish the Harvest Doves Primary School in Kayunga. So many people donated items and many donated money for items they were going to give to other people. Corn was taken to be used in their homes and to give to their friends. Over and over through each day we were blessed to share our faith and have others share their faith and why they wanted to reach out to others as a blessing during these uncertain times where so many are faced with difficult and confusing circumstances. The donations from the garage sale were also used to help build the church fellowship in Kayunga in central Africa and we have sent \$3,550 of the \$5,520 needed to finish the building for the church fellowship in Iganga where many of the Muslims are coming to faith in Jesus Christ every day.

What a wonderful time of sharing the love of Jesus and helping teach these young people on the 2nd and 4th Saturday of each month at Harvest Kids. Many thanks to everyone that prays for and supports these young disciples as they grow in their faith and use their gifts and talents to build up the Body of Christ. Even in the midst of the smoke from the forest fires and the garage sale that we hosted to raise donations for the ongoing work of the ministry, these young people are excited. Each time we meet, the kids spend time crushing cans that have been donated. We were blessed to share that we took 500# of aluminum cans to the recycle, and although the price is deflated, we still received \$77 to support the pygmy tribe teachers in the DR Congo and the Comfort Africa ministry to vulnerable children in Uganda. The kids watched a video of their recent Child's Evangelism Fellowship 5-day club in Mt. Vernon and after counting the change that they had brought had enough to pay for the last of the mosquito nets for the boys at the Nalidi Grace primary school in Uganda with some extra that the kids wanted them to use to buy much needed food. At the first meeting, the kids had 2 pumpkins that were harvested from the Garden of Eden farming ministry and will be used by friends, Gary and Cathy, to make pumpkin bread and pies. The kids guessed how many loaves and pies would come from each one and then guessed the total seeds that will be in them. Lynn, from Child's Evangelism Fellowship, came and reviewed the lessons from the 5-day club from a few weeks ago which focused on Jesus as the only way. Each day had a Word Up and used a person from the Bible to demonstrate how it was applied and was re-enforced with scripture. Day 1 - "God's way is the only way", Namaan, John 14:6; Day 2 - "Have faith", Cain & Abel, Ephesians 1:7; Day 3 - "God is merciful", Rahab, 1 Peter 3:18a; Day 4 - "Jesus gives hope", Jairus, John 20:31 and Day 5 - "God can forgive", the prodigal son, Jeremiah 31:3b. It was amazing to witness that when Lynn reviewed the scriptures, all the kids remembered them. Praise God! The message for today was: "Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?' And I said, 'Here am I. Send me!'" (Isaiah 6:8) Lynn shared about a missionary to the Navajo people years ago and the way in which God used her. It was a blessing that Harvest Vision has been blessed to partner with a wonderful woman from the Navajo Indian Reservation in Arizona and she has made beautiful jewelry and given it to us for the ministry. The kids were all able to take a beautiful piece of silver and turquoise piece for themselves and for their mothers.

We shared the news about the 6,000 ears of sweet corn and all the money that was donated to build the Harvest Doves Primary School in Africa. They are praying that others will help them raise the \$4,200 remaining to finish the school. They started filling the bucket and will not count it until it is full. A big bucket but they know they serve a big God. The two pumpkins had now become pumpkin pies and pumpkin bread and the kids were amazed that their guesses were all lower than what God had supplied. The answer - 8 pies from one and 23 small loaves of pumpkin bread from the other and a total of 783 seeds. Thanks to Gary and Linda for offering their baking skills. We talked about how important it is that we share about Jesus with all of our family and friends and let them know we love them and Jesus does too. We talked about how the seed of faith that God puts in our heart when we repent and receive His forgiveness is always working to bring others to God's love and eternal life. A great time of faith, fun and fellowship as we left pondering this question knowing that we had counted 783 seeds in those two small pumpkins. "How many pumpkins are in one seed?"

The kids were blessed to take a pie and bread home to share with their families.
